

News and Views from Mr. Schmit

Greetings,

Well, the month of April at St. John School is in the books. We will be flipping our calendars to May on Sunday. Get ready for a flurry of activities over the final six weeks of school!

Here's the last Friday of April rundown:

- **Covid:** In the last week we have had a couple of positive Covid cases in the school. Following GCHD protocol we no longer have to quarantine close contacts at school among other changes to the procedures we followed earlier this school year. The current protocol places an emphasis on home/family close contacts, dealing with isolating actual positive cases while allowing for family in the home NOT experiencing symptoms to continue on with their daily routines while wearing a tightly fitting mask. This part of my rundown is meant to simply inform you as to what is going on and to encourage families to take necessary precautions if someone in the family is sick or has tested positive for Covid19.
- **Beauty and the Beast:** The Drama Club performed Beauty and the Beast for the entire school body this last Monday afternoon. They have continued working hard rehearsing and preparing for their THREE performances tonight and tomorrow afternoon on the stage at Powers Catholic High School. Show times are tonight at 6:30 PM, and tomorrow at 1 PM and 5 PM. Thank you to Melanie McPeake and all the parents who have been giving their time to help our 4th-8th Grade drama students to be able to perform this show.
- **Mary Crowning:** May 4th our 8th Grade will crown Mary with a procession prior to the 8:20 Mass. Beginning with this mass, for the rest of the school year, parents and parishioners will be back in the church once again. If you attend Mass over the final several Wednesdays, please plan on sitting in the back pews of the Church while the school homerooms will sit together toward the front.
- **Run for the Roses Dinner:** The St. John Education Foundation's annual dinner will be on Saturday, May 7, 2022. The Foundation needs 9 or 10 more volunteers to help at the bourbon bar, the selling of tickets during the event, assist with the parking lot and with clean-up. - **Playground Addition:** We are moving forward with our playground project. We have the big, beautiful upper playground that the Kindergarten on up age groups can enjoy daily. We will be adding new features to the grassy lot (still inside the green fence) with a playground expansion that even our youngest learners can utilize. We have been accepting donations for this project since the Fall. In order to help finalize the raising of funds for this playground we have partnered with Booster, a company that puts on a Fun Run Fundraiser. Donor/Pledge information will be coming soon but our Fun Run day is scheduled during the school day on Friday, May 20th. Come out and cheer on our students as they raise funds to support the playground project and SJS athletics program!


News and Views from Mr. Schmit (continued)

We will hear another one of John's resurrection accounts at Mass this weekend. The account is jam packed with all kinds of symbolism that it is difficult to focus on one thing. We will hear the account of how Jesus helped the Disciples catch a huge quantity of fish and how some came to recognize him in the "breaking of the bread." The story has some of the Disciples going out with Peter, going back to their old way of life, so to speak, to do some fishing. That group didn't catch a thing until Jesus appeared on the shore and told them where to cast their nets. They then brought in a haul of fish that prompted "the disciple whom Jesus loved" to exclaim to Peter, "It is the Lord." Then the account goes on to tell personal feats of endurance and strength for Peter from open water swimming to dragging that huge haul of fish all by himself. I could focus on how Peter was moved by the Holy Spirit to impulsively show off his super human abilities. Or I could focus on how the Disciples were out trying to return to their normal lives despite their knowledge of the Resurrection. However, it is how the Disciples came to truly recognize Jesus in "the breaking of the Bread."

God has been using the Mass and our times of Eucharistic Adoration this year to bring the members of St. John School in closer to Himself. In fact, a group of 7th grade students shared with me earlier how grateful they were to attend the daily morning mass today because they were able to sit near the front and really focus on Jesus. I also had a profound moment this morning as I was able to bring Jesus from the tabernacle to the school for Adoration. I had so many issues weighing on me, but as I knelt before Jesus in our school's prayer room, I felt a tremendous sense of peace because he was right there. I stopped listening to the extra noise from my life and recognized Him in that moment. We need to help our children come to the realization that we all need Jesus and he is present to us. We need Jesus in everything we do so that we are truly examples to our families. We need more of Jesus so our kids can know him and through their personal encounters with Christ they can begin to treat their classmates and teachers with care, mercy, respect and love. Without Jesus this is not possible. Let us pray that ALL of our hearts are moved to change so that we can help bring about His glory.




Adoration Sign Up for Parents


