Greetings,

I hope and pray you had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. It has been wonderful to see all of the students back in the classrooms, engaged in their lessons and activities throughout this week.

Here's the first Friday of 2022 Rundown:

• Covid Protocols: As I communicated in the email that was sent out prior to break, we will continue with the same Covid protocols that have been in place this school year. Although there has been plenty of conversation and confusion having to do with the GCHD mask mandate changes, the quarantine and close contact protocols remain the same. Universal masking is helping to keep our in school close contact numbers basically at zero. However, we do have a growing number of families dealing with Covid19 post Christmas so remaining diligent with our protocols will keep students, staff, and families healthy while allowing students to remain coming to school for in-person learning.

• Music Teacher: My search for a music teacher has come up empty so far but all hope isn't lost. Mr. Freeman Tucker has agreed to serve as a long term substitute teacher as the search continues. There will be times when Mr. Tucker needs to perform his duties as our parish music minister. In those instances, Mrs. Wright and myself will step in as substitute teachers. Mr. Tucker is excited for the opportunity to teach music to our school children. I stopped by the music room this morning and the students were singing and sure enjoying the lesson that Mr. Tucker was leading them through.

• 2022 The Big Game Auction: Thank you all for your generous support of our school. Since I've been in this position money raised from the auction has helped us purchase a new classroom smartboard and projector, a new volleyball net/pole system, volleyballs, bottle filling station in the gym, Chromebooks, fourth and fifth grade social studies curriculum, and a classroom set of calculators along with supplies and resources for individual classrooms. 
