

News and Views from Mr. Schmit

Greetings,

We were brought back to the realities of Michigan Winters this week after those 50 degree, sunny days we had recently. Despite the snow days I was still able to serve on an accreditation site visit for St. Patrick in Brighton, although half of it was spent meeting virtually. It is always beneficial to serve on these visitation teams to garner ideas from schools across the Diocese of Lansing and see if we can emulate any of the exemplary best practices displayed.

Last Friday of February Rundown:

• 40 Cans of Lent: Knights of Columbus food drive to benefit the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry. There are special item requests such as boxes of cereal, pancake mix, syrup, jelly, oatmeal, spaghetti noodles, cheeseburger helper, egg noodles, white rice, instant potatoes, Ramen noodles, Dinty Moore Beef Stew, corn, green beans, spaghetti sauce, pork and beans, chili, sloppy joe sauce, liquid laundry detergent, shampoo, toothpaste, tooth brushes, floss, dish soap and toilet paper. The collection box will be outside the main office until Holy Week (week of April 2nd).

• Divine Mercy Chaplet: A small group of our students were recorded praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet in the St. John Alive studio. We posted a link to the audio recording on our social media. Every Friday during Lent at 3pm we will repost the link so you can pray the chaplet wherever you are, unified as a community.

• Preschool/Kindergarten Information and Roundup: The Preschool/Kindergarten information night is NEXT Thursday, March 2 from 5pm-6pm. Parents will be able to come and receive information about our programs and have the opportunity for a Q and A session. Children will be able to spend time in the classrooms to experience a snapshot of day in the life of a preschool/kindergarten student at St. John School. Register for this event <u>here.</u>

• Parent-Teacher Conferences: Conferences will be during the afternoon and evening of Thursday, March 9. This round of conferences is by parent or teacher request only.

• Science Night: We will be hosting a Science Night at St. John, Thursday, March 16. More information will be coming soon. This night will also be an opportunity for everyone to see the Science Fair exhibits by our middle school students!

• Johnny The Eagle: We are beginning to work on our branding/marketing guidelines so we have clear rules for logos, color scheme, font size for spirit wear and athletic wear among other things. Over the last couple of years we decided to use the St. John parish logo on our spirit wear clothing along with creating a line of spirit wear with sayings to spread the evangelization mission of St. John School/Parish. However, we will begin once again incorporating St. John Jets into our spirit wear, through a unified look and color scheme. We have also decided to introduce a modified mascot into the branding package. With the start of our Junior Jets Basketball program we thought it was a great time to unveil "Johnny the Eagle" on the

Basketball jersey for our K-4 participants. Johnny the Eagle is outfitted in jet pilot attire, complete with a helmet and pair of goggles. See what we did there? But why an eagle? Aren't we the Jets? Glad you asked and it's a good thing I used to teach Sacred Scriptures to Juniors at Powers Catholic because the answer is rooted there! Each of the four Evangelists of the Gospels within the New Testament is denoted with a symbol. The symbol for Matthew is an angel, Mark is a Lion, Luke is an Ox, and John is an eagle. (Next time you are driving past the church on Adelaide Street take note of the statue out front. The statue is of the Evangelist John and at his feet stands an eagle.) So, in summary, we are still the St. John Jets but adding a new element to our branding. Go Jets!

Unfortunately due to the snow day on Wednesday we were not able to all be gathered together for our Ash Wednesday liturgy. During his homily on Wednesday, Fr. Robert introduced us to the image of the "earthen vessel" that will be used by Fr. and the Deacons throughout Lent to help show us the sanctifying grace of Christ's death and resurrection. The earthen vessel is a biblical image used to describe God creating humanity from the dust of the earth. Remember in the story of the Garden of Eden from Genesis 2, "the LORD God formed the man out of the dust of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being." This is why one of the phrases we hear from the priest during the distribution of ashes is "Remember you" are dust and to dust you shall return." Apologies. I kind of went down a rabbit hole there. Back to the vessels...The outer vessel is beautiful and God's creation but not intended to last. What's inside the vessel is what counts. St. Paul in 2 Corinthians wrote, "therefore, we are not discouraged; rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day." With this verse in mind, we have a tremendous opportunity to take a hard look at ourselves to make sure we are filling up our "earthen vessel" with things that will help us on the path to holiness. This is partly why we "give up" things for Lent. However, with the Lenten observance we should be focused with what we are doing instead of that thing to help us on the path to holiness. For instance, I'm giving up technology after I get home from work and I will "fill in the blank" (spend more time in prayer, more time with my family, more time reading scripture). Let us use this holy season of Lent to work on renewing our inner selves and becoming better versions of ourselves so that we are better people, parents, spouses, employees, and so on.

God bless and let's use this weekend to get ready for a full five day week of school!

The STEAM lab is in need of paper tubes for upcoming projects. If you have any empty paper towel or toilet


paper tubes ready to be upcycled, please bring them to Mr. Willard at any time.


