News and Views from Mr. Schmit

Greetings,

We have had another outstanding week at St. John School. Since my comments below are lengthy, let us jump right into the Day 85 rundown:

- The Michigan Association of Non-public Schools Accreditation visit is scheduled for Tuesday and Wednesday of this coming week. Please keep the team in prayer as they review our documentation in order to make the appropriate recommendation for accreditation.
- Our 4th-8th Grade Social Studies Curriculum and 7th and 8th Grade Math Curriculum have been in need of updating. We have been doing our research but have needed the financial backing to make the change in curriculum for both subjects. I am pleased to announce that we will be able to upgrade both our social studies curriculum and math curriculum due to a generous contribution made by Mr. and Mrs. Randy and Kathy Wise. Their contribution along with the current fundraising initiatives of the Education Foundation will allow St. John to successfully update both areas of need and be ready for next school year.
- NWEA Map Celebration: Both of our 6th Grade homerooms showed significant growth from the Fall to the Winter test in their Math NWEA Map scores. Both homerooms increased by an average of 4 points each. Our 7th grade homeroom achieved an average of 7 points of growth. Our first through eighth grade NWEA MAP Math and Reading assessments will continue throughout the next two weeks.
- SJS 5th-8th Grade Athletics has been on pause since mid-November. The GCCS principals have been meeting
 over the last two months to determine how to proceed if and when athletics are allowed. It has been an arduous
 conversation because of the unknowns and knowing how essential athletics are for our developing students, all
 while not wanting anything to compromise our day-to-day in-person instruction. In the end, I had to make the
 difficult decision to keep St. John School out of the Flint Area Catholic Schools League for the upcoming girls
 volleyball season and more than likely the boys and girls basketball seasons. I made the decision to protect the
 health and well being of our students while knowing each of these seasons will need to be abbreviated in order
 to get them completed for an eventual spring athletic season. With that being stated, SJS WILL STILL HOST
 OUR OWN athletic opportunities over the coming weeks. (Please see page 2 for more Athletic information). I am
 extremely grateful for Scott McPeake and our volunteer coaches for coming up with a plan so our students can
 still participate in volleyball, basketball, and cheer squad this winter.

Back in the beginning of August our enrollment was slightly over 190 K-8 students. On Monday, we will have over 230 students K-8 students enrolled, with a number of grades at capacity to keep our 2020-21 protocols in place. We have had a number of new families join our school this year, but as I go around to the classrooms or visit with the students during lunch it is difficult to pinpoint which student is new and which student has been here for years. The students and staff have been able to overcome the distancing and mask wearing obstacles and establish a true sense of community. I am incredibly grateful.

Let us continue to pray for the staff, students, and families as we maneuver through this crazy but beautiful school year.
