The resiliency of our students and staff is amazing. There are only eight more days of school so let's jump to the rundown.

Memorial Day Weekend Rundown:

- Grandparents Mass: Thank you to all who came to the mass this past week. It was truly a beautiful and inspiring mass. It was great to see an almost full church of people gathered together to pray as a community of believers. I have not made any concrete decision as to the next one but after giving it some thought I believe we will stick with a mid to late May Grandparent Mass next year.
- School Safety: Thank you to Fenton City Police for being present on our campus this week. In an ongoing effort to provide safety and security for our school community, I have signed a short-term contract with Premier Security. We will have a security guard in and around the school for the remainder of the school year. Premier will also be providing me with an assessment of our campus safety and security policies.
- Counseling: I continue to explore all avenues as it relates to providing counseling for our St. John students. I have not found anyone, yet, who we can contract with or hire but just this afternoon I have made some inroads for potential solutions for the 2022-23 school year. I will keep you updated.
- Final All School Mass: Wednesday, June 1 at 8:20 AM will be the final All School Mass of the school year.
- 8th Grade Graduation Mass: All are invited to the 8th Grade Graduation Mass on Wednesday, June 8 at 6 PM in the Church. Our Youth Choir will be singing at this mass.
- 4th-7th Grade Honors Convocation: We will have a 4th-7th Grade Honors Convocation on Thursday, June 9 at 9:15 AM. Students will be required to be in uniform that day. Please come and gather with us in the church to honor our students!
- Final Eucharistic Procession of the school year: We will have a Eucharistic Procession on the last day of school, June 9 at 11:00 AM. Please come into the building to worship and pray with us as we thank God for all he has done for us this school year!


• Last Day of School Celebration: On Thursday, June 9, we will dismiss our Kindergarten to 7th Grade students at 11:30 AM using the back steps (just like last year). Parents, please park in the Activity Center lot and walk down the steps to the outfield grass, next to the Knights of Columbus parking lot. We will have music, a closing prayer and celebrate our students as we introduce them as their next year grade level.

• <u>Unselfie</u>: I will be sending home a copy of the book <u>Unselfie</u> to each family for a summer reading assignment. I cannot stress enough how important it is for parents to read this book. I have attempted to provide snippets of insight and information throughout the school year but really need our community to dive in themselves and read so that we can begin putting the author's lessons to practice with our children. We need our children to learn empathy. There is no way around it. We as parents set the tone for our children. If we want our children to be kind and helpful, showing empathy, then we need to be kind, helpful and empathetic ourselves.

One of the songs our Youth Choir has been singing at All School Mass is the "Fragrance Prayer," which has been adapted to music from the original prayer written by Cardinal John Henry Newman. The song/prayer is a reminder of how our lives need to be truly lived on a daily basis. "Dear Jesus, help me to spread Your fragrance everywhere I go/ Flood my soul with Your spirit and life/ Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly, that my life may only be a radiance of Yours." Our children have been singing these words at Mass and I pray that these words will be life changing and life giving for this community. God used these words to challenge me and move me while we are all gathered at the Grandparent Mass and I hope and pray he can use them to change the hearts of all who hear, or sing, or pray these words.




