News and Views from Mr. Schmit

Greetings,

I hope and pray you are well and enjoying your Friday (or Saturday, or Sunday, or whenever you are reading this). I have a lot of information in the rundown so let's get to it.

January 20th Rundown:

- Report Cards: The 2nd Quarter Report Cards will be made available in the parent portal at 4pm this
 afternoon.
- Enrollment update: As of this afternoon we have 75% of our current students enrolled for the 2023-24 school year.
- Attendance: I have not stressed attendance enough this year as we have shifted from Covid protocols to a more normal-ish routine. I need our school community to understand the importance of being here at school, on time, for the duration of the school day on a consistent basis. Going forward I remind everyone of the SJS Attendance Policy: "All students enrolled in St. John the Evangelist Catholic School are expected to be punctual and regular in attendance. Students attend school every scheduled school day for the entire day and are expected to be in assigned areas at assigned times unless officially excused. Absence from school will be excused if: absence was caused by illness, it is a case of emergency, or satisfactory arrangements have been made with administration)." 8 unexcused absences begins the notification process with 15 unexcused absences resulting in the school notifying the truancy officer for Genesee County. PLEASE NOTE: 3 Tardies constitute 1 unexcused absence.
- More on attendance: **Good Attendance**-9 or fewer absences: students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more, **Warning**-10-17 absences: students who are absent an average of 15 days a year miss a year's worth of school BEFORE their senior year of high school. Missing a day of school puts a student behind classmates. **Chronic Absenteeism**-18 more absences: Excused and Unexcused absences represent lost time in the classroom and lost opportunities to learn. Missing just one day every two weeks can add up to 18 days in a year.
- Dismissal: All students are to be dismissed to their assigned loop lines (preschool and siblings in front, kindergarten to 3rd grade plus siblings in the upper loop and fourth grade to eighth grade in the lower loop) unless a parent has purchased one of the auction spots, or previous arrangements have been made with the office. Students cannot leave school or hang out in front of the school waiting for their ride upon dismissal without being accompanied by an adult (parent or school staff member).
- Tuition Assistance: The Diocesan deadline for Tuition Assistance is March 1. Tuition assistance is only available for Kindergarten through 12th Grade students. If you are seeking financial assistance through St. John School, you should still apply with FACTS. We use the same information to award financial assistance as well.
- New Family Open House: If you have friends, neighbors, family members, co-workers who have been asking you about St. John School, invite them to attend our Open House on Thursday, February 2 from 5pm to 7pm. More information will be coming soon! Our Open Enrollment Period for new family registration opens on Thursday, February 2.

- Catholic Schools Week: Our annual Catholic Schools week begins on January 29. Our Catholic Schools Week committee has some fun activities planned for us throughout the week. If there are any dads who are Knights of Columbus members, we need volunteers to help with the Knights of Columbus Pancake Breakfast for students and staff on Tuesday, January 31. I've heard from three Dads thus far. Please email me if you are interested in helping us out that morning.
- Boots and Buckles Auction: The Auction is only two weeks from now! Last year the Auction netted us nearly \$185,000. If you look around the school, those funds helped us upgrade and add to our security camera system, purchase materials for classrooms, take out the mess of shrubbery behind the school, purchase chromebooks, replace some doors and windows, and do some necessary infrastructure maintenance within the school. There are so many opportunities to help as we are heading into the final preparations for the big event. More information about our upcoming Auction can be found on page 5 of this week's Jet Gazette, in particular regarding raffle tickets, the tuition raffle, and day of event ticket sales. Yeehaw!
- Food Service: Please be sure to check your child's account to make sure that it is in good standing.
- Parking Lot: Parents and staff members, please drive SLOWLY and follow the correct traffic patterns while driving through our parking lot, especially in the morning. We have had a couple of close calls recently. If you are going to be entering the drop off lane, please use the second lane that runs directly in front of the Activity Center. If you are going to be driving through to park, please use the first lane that runs directly behind the Church.
- Join us for Mass this weekend: Our Mass times are 5pm on Saturday and 8:30, 10, and 11:30 on Sunday.

The last couple of weeks I have been struggling to get around the school to be a part of the day to day learning activities in the classrooms, to be with the kids and support the teachers due to a host of things that I have had to focus on from the confines of my prison cell...I mean office. However, I need to change my perspective and be positive. So instead of prison cell I shall refer to my office as "the place of positivity from which problems are solved and hope abounds. (This will make sense with my discussion in the next paragraph.)

These issues and recent experiences have reminded me of a section from Dr. Borba's "Thrivers" book that we could all use in our day to day raising of children (and quite frankly in our own lives), in which she devotes an entire chapter to the teaching of optimism. Within Chapter seven she calls upon some of Aaron Beck's University of Pennsylvania research on behavior: how we think (cognition), feel (emotion), and act (behavior) interact. Sometimes people mistakenly fall into the "I don't feel like it today," feelings determine behavior (FDB) trap. We have the choice laid out in front of us to focus on the positive or to focus on the negative. Ultimately, successful, joy-filled people are optimistic and thankfully for us parents, this trait can be taught. Dr. Borba stresses that the first way to teach the trait of optimism is to model optimistic thinking. She spends some time reflecting on how optimism was passed to the British generation that endured The Blitz of 1940-41, in which over three hundred tons of bombs were dropped on London. The children of London did what their parents did and that was to model optimism and hope. "Kids who thrive in tough times have caring adults in their lives who model a positive outlook." Essentially, teaching optimism begins with us. We are inundated with negativity. I don't need to point out where this negativity is coming from but we can all identify it within our lives. Changing our perspective, our mind set to a positive one is difficult but knowing that we are influencing our children for the better should motivate us all. I will continue with some more thoughts on optimism in next week's Jet.



2023-2024 Tuition Assistance

The window to apply for tuition assistance for the 2023-2024 school year is now open. **Applications are due by March 1, 2023** if you would like to be considered for grants from the Diocese of Lansing.

Both the St. John Scholarship Fund and the Diocese of Lansing Scholarship Program are need-based assistance programs. Need is determined by an independent, third party service, FACTS Management, which makes its assessment based on income and tax information. The application is only available online and requires a \$35 application fee. Families applying only need to fill out one application for consideration for both St. John and Diocese of Lansing assistance. You do not need to fill out an application for each child. You must fill out this application to be considered for any form of tuition assistance from the St. John School Scholarship Fund or from the Diocese of Lansing Scholarship Program. A link to the application is provided at the end of this email.

Grant Criteria eligibility for all grants:

Families must complete a FACTS financial aid application online on or before March 1, 2023 to be considered for any of the Diocese of Lansing grants. You may still apply for assistance from the St. John Scholarship Fund after this date.

Student must show a financial need of at least \$750.00.

The student must be Catholic, attend a Diocese of Lansing school, and belong to a parish in the Diocese of Lansing.

Please note that tuition assistance is only available for students in grades K-12. Preschool students are not eligible for tuition assistance.

Diocese of Lansing Grant:

Grades K-8 \$750 per student

Grades 9-12 \$1000 per student

Once the FACTS online form has been completed, the following information will need to be submitted to FACTS:

- Copies of your most recent Federal tax forms including all supporting tax schedules and W2's.
- Copies of supporting documentation for Social Security Income, Welfare, Child Support, Food Stamps, Workers' Compensation, and TANF.
- Copies of Federal Tax Forms from 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 (for business owners)
 All supporting documentation must be uploaded online through the FACTS online form.


