Daily School Hours for 2023-2024

We are in compliance with the Diocese of Lansing Education Department regarding instructional time requirements for 2023-2024. The State of Michigan and the Diocese of Lansing require schools to schedule 1098 hours and 180 days of instruction in a school year. The Diocese of Lansing complies with state laws regarding the number of fire and tornado drills required per year, certification of teachers, the number of school days and instructional hours per year.

MORNING DROP OFF LOOP WILL OPEN DAILY AT 7:40 AM. Please do not release students from your cars until the loop is officially open and supervisors are present. If you need to drop your child off prior to 7:40, please register him or her for Jets Club.





School office hours are Monday-Friday 7:30 AM to 4:00 PM when school is in session.

PLEASE NOTE: The office will be CLOSED DAILY from 3:10-3:30 PM to allow office staff to assist with dismissal procedures. Phones will still be open (you may have to leave a message), but the office will be closed to ALL visitors. Any students needing early dismissal will need to be picked up prior to 3:10 PM. After 3:10 PM, all students will be sent to the preschool loop, upper loop, or Jets Club. Students may not wait by the office.

School Supplies

The majority of school supplies are included with the cost of tuition. There are just a couple things that will need to be provided from home:

- Backpack—Large enough to fit folders and books
- **Gym shoes**—Clean with non-marking soles. Must be able to be left at school. Gym shoes do not need to be brand new.
- Art shirt—Large, old shirt or t-shirt that will fit over school uniform shirt.
- Students in grades 5-8 have lockers if they wish to bring locker supplies/decorations.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

On the first day of school, there will be no Morning Loop Drop Off. K-8 families may park over by the Activity Center and gather in the courtyard. Teachers will come out to meet their students when the first bell rings at 8 AM. Students will say "See you soon" to their families and walk to class with their teachers. K-8 students will begin normal Morning Loop procedures on Wednesday, August 23rd.

On Wednesday, August 23rd, preschool families may park and walk to the main entrance beginning at 7:45 AM. Preschool classroom aides will be by the main entrance to greet students as they say "See you soon" to their families and walk into the building with the classroom aides. Preschool students will begin normal Morning Loop procedures on Thursday, August 24th.

Preschool Information

- ALL preschool students will be dismissed at 11:15 during the first week of school. Your child's teacher will communicate dismissal procedures to you.
- Preschool students will need a backpack, art shirt (old t-shirts work great), and rest blanket (full day students only).
- Open House Sign Up Genius will be sent from your child's teacher. Preschool ONLY will have slots available from 4 PM to 6 PM for you and your child to meet your teacher and our the classroom. Please contact your child's teacher if you are unable to attend the open house. Please note K-8 Meet the Teacher will begin at 5 PM and will be drop-in style.

Important Parent Information

• 2023-2024 Student Emergency card

On Tuesday, August 22, the oldest child in each family will receive an Emergency Card to take home. This must be completed on both sides by a parent. Please return it the <u>next school day</u> with your student. It is imperative that we have updated emergency numbers on hand for your children. Please be sure that at least one parent and/or emergency contact can be available to pick up your child within 30 minutes in the event your child becomes sick at school.

Scrip Program:

SCRIP is a program which allows families to purchase gift cards to various businesses, many of them local. Using these cards toward everyday purchases is

an easy way to reduce tuition costs. Businesses give a small rebate to the school for each gift card purchase. School Uniform Information

School uniforms are required for all students preschool-8th grade. **Uniforms MUST be from Dennis Uniform.** For online shopping, please use code "HAA" for approved items for St. John School. During a typical week, a uniform is required Monday through Thursday and students may wear spiritwear on Fridays. We still have a supply of Dennis Uniform Scrip available in the office. This is sold at an 8% discount off the face value and may be used for online and in-store purchases. The office can only accept

cash or check for the purchase of scrip.

All Middle School students should have a gym uniform purchased from Dennis Uniform for the 2023-2024 school year.

Spiritwear

The PSA will have spiritwear items for sale during the Back to School Night. Spriitwear may also be purchased through our online <u>Spiritwear Store</u>. Items will be restocked soon, including some new arrivals!

On Spiritwear days, students may wear St. John School or Powers Catholic High School apparel with jeans or uniform bottoms. Jeans should be in good condition free from rips or tears. Students may not

wear leggings to school on spiritwear days or out of uniform days. This applies to all students from preschool to 8th grade.

Students who are not wearing the appropriate uniform or spiritwear may be asked to change into something from the uniform closet or be asked to call home for a change of clothes.

Additional Dress Code Information

Please note that students are asked to adhere to the following guidelines as indicated in our Parent Student Handbook:

- No uniform/spiritwear shorts may be worn during the period from November 1st through March 31st. During this time period, leggings or tights ARE REQUIRED for any girls wearing uniform skirts or jumpers. No bare legs during this time period.
- Shirts should be tucked in at all times. (Age appropriate grade levels)
- Belts must be worn on Dennis Uniform items with belt loops. (Age appropriate grade levels)
- Socks or Tights must be worn at all times.
- Shoes must be secure on the foot with closed toe and closed heel. No Crocs or open-toe sandals may be worn Outdoor boots must be removed outside the classroom and may not be worn throughout the school. Fashion boots such as UGGS, cowboy boots, etc. may be worn on Spirit Days only.
- Leggings may not be worn as pants by students of any age (preschool-8th grade) on any uniform, spiritwear, or out of uniform day. The exception is leggings that are worn UNDERNEATH a uniform skirt.

All faculty and administrators have the right to judge what is and is not appropriate regarding the Uniform Dress Code and to enforce consequences for inappropriate dress.



Student Health and Wellness

Immunizations

- For Nonmedical waivers (religious, philosophical or other objections), parents should visit their county health department. Waivers will then be digitally uploaded into the MCIR database from the health department.
- If your child has a medical reason (a true contraindication or precaution) for not receiving a vaccine, a physician must sign the State of Michigan Medical Contraindication form; this form is available at your doctor's office (not the county health department).
- Based on the public health code, a child without either an up-to-date immunization record, a certified nonmedical waiver form or a physician signed medical waiver form can be excluded from school. (Taken from the Health Dept. parent letter January 13, 2015)

St. John remains committed to being a Nut Free School. We have several students with life threatening allergies to peanuts and tree nuts. Please remember when packing lunches and snacks that our classes and lunchroom are nut free. Thank you for helping to keep our learning environment safe for all our students.

Parents of Children with Allergies

If your child has allergies that are significant enough to warrant accommodation in the school setting, please send a written evaluation from the allergist, with any recommendations that the allergist may have, to the school office as soon as possible. Allergy plan forms are available in the school office. A current head & shoulders photo of each child with allergies is needed in the office. Please email a photo to Mrs. Anderson at danderson@sjseducation.com or come to the office to have a photo taken.

MEDICATIONS

Any medication for your child must be kept in the school office. Medications should be labeled. You must also fill out a medication authorization form before any medication can be given. The form is available in the office or on the school website. Please note that we do not keep general medications on hand, such as Tylenol or Ibuprofen. All medications must be provided by parents.

The cost of a student lunch is \$3.25.

The cost of student breakfast is \$2.00

A la carte items are available at breakfast and lunch and cost ranges from \$0.50 to \$1.25.

Requirements for Volunteers

The Diocese of Lansing requires that anyone who has contact with minor children receive Virtus Training, including all volunteers. In order to be a volunteer at St. John the Evangelist Catholic School, you must complete the following:

1. Register online at https://www.virtusonline.org for an online training session.

2. Read and sign the Diocese of Lansing Volunteer Code of Conduct. This form is available in the school office or you can print one <u>here.</u>

3. Read and sign the Diocese of Lansing Criminal Background Check Form. This form is available in the school office or you can print one <u>here</u>.

**Please note that if you were contacted to complete a Virtus refresher course and have not had a chance to complete it, you are ineligible to volunteer until the course is completed per diocesan rules. Contact Mrs. Haiss if you have any questions.

You may not participate in any volunteer positions until you have completed all requirements.

Parents Volunteering or Supervising at the school

A minimum of 18 volunteer hours is required each school year for families with students in grades K-8. Preschool only parents are required to volunteer 10 hours. There are many opportunities to volunteer throughout the school year including athletics, Applefest, PSA auction, Book Fair, field trips, homeroom parents, popcorn Fridays, and many others. The best way to stay informed about these opportunities are by reading the Jet Gazette and teacher newsletters/emails regularly. We are always looking for people to help.

- Dress appropriately. (Use student dress code requirements as a guideline.)
- Enter/Exit Main Entrance only
- Please sign in at the school office and take a visitor or volunteer sticker when you enter the building.
- Please do not go to your child's classroom unannounced.
- Please sign out in the school office before you leave the building.

- Foster a profound appreciation for the ideals of Catholic Christian education in the home and to promote Catholic Christian education through cooperation with the faculty and parish






