First Friday of May Rundown:

St. John Foundation Annual Derby Dinner

Barb Walstrom and her team continue to plan and put together another fantastic evening, Saturday May 3 at St. John School. The Foundation was founded in 1980 with the goal of generating funds to offset the school's need for parish subsidy. Although the Foundation has yet to achieve its intended goal, it works to continue to raise funds to help push the corpus and events like the annual Derby Dinner go a long way in helping the Foundation continue to support St. John Parish and School.

Mary Crowning:

Each year Catholic schools crown Mary in May because the Church dedicates this month to her, honoring her as the Queen of Heaven and the Mother of Jesus. The May Crowning, often led by students (and in our case the 8th graders) placing a floral crown on a statue of Mary, celebrates her virtues, especially her faith, humility, and maternal care for the Church. It's a beautiful tradition that brings the school community

together in prayer and devotion, helping students grow in their love for Mary and see her as a spiritual mother and model of holiness. Our Mary Crowning will take place before this Wednesday's All School Mass, May 7.

Amazing Shake:

We're excited to bring back The Amazing Shake competition for our middle school students on Friday, May 9. This event emphasizes eye contact, a firm handshake, and confident communication, as students work through a series of real-world simulations led by local business leaders and community volunteers. We were truly blessed with beautiful weather, a knowledgeable tour guide, a skilled bus driver, an enthusiastic group of parent chaperones, and the steady leadership of Mrs. Whitney.

- Poise under pressure




